March is Developmental Disabilities Awareness

March is Developmental Disabilities Awareness Month, and the theme is "Life Without Limits, Building our Future Together". The Carroll County Board of Developmental Disabilities vision is "Live, Work, Play Together" which was recently updated from the previous vision of Integration in the Community. Terminology and intent mean everything. Integration sounds good but in reality, it was still separating people with disabilities from those

without. An example is taking a group of people with developmental disabilities to the art center for an art class that is only for people with disabilities.

The Board is all about community inclusion. This means we want people with disabilities to have the same options as all of us. An example of inclusion is people with developmental disabilities attending church with everyone else in the community. There they can make connections with people without disabilities that miss them when they are not there, that may provide rides to and from church, and develop relationships that are meaningful to both parties. Again, this is our vision to "Live, Work, Play Together".

I want to highlight some services of the Board. A big "great job!" goes out to our preschool staff. The Ohio Department of Education did an unannounced visit at our preschool on 3-6-2023. The Board received zero citations from the licensing inspection report. When we talk about inclusion our preschool is a great example. The preschool serves both typical and atypical students.

The Family Support Department is another service I want to highlight. The Board continues to find gaps in services and meet those service needs. We are always looking for providers to job coach, the Board has two staff who provide job coaching services when providers are unable. County Board staff continue to reach out to local school districts to help students on Individual Education Plans age 14 and older for work transition services. We are increasing referrals to Opportunities for Ohioans with Disabilities for job support. Staff in the Family Support Department are also in the schools promoting self-advocacy through the Academy for Leadership Abilities.



Kristen Long was a teen when she was diagnosed with a rare genetic condition called Fibrodysplasia Ossificans Progressiva. This disability turns soft tissue into bone, making it extremely difficult for her to complete daily tasks without assistance. In 2008, Kristen started working at Carroll Hills Industries doing piece work, but it was quickly evident that she was capable of more. Kristen moved to the front office where she worked independently answering phones, greeting visitors, providing data entry for Medicaid billing, etc. Kristen expressed interest and attended Self-Advocacy training, which led her to become the first in Carroll County. Kristen led Self-Advocacy Group meetings at Carroll Hills providing insight to others on how to become their own self-advocate. Countless individuals followed her example and have become their own self- advocate since then.

By 2018, Kristen was ready for a change. The Carroll County General Health District needed an Administrative Assistant in the Nursing Division, and Kristen was given the opportunity to prove herself.

She enthusiastically learned to schedule appointments, bill insurance for services provided, support grant materials and data collection, and much more. Kristen wanted more so she pursued a college degree. Kristen graduated with a Bachelor of Science in Accounting which helped her understand more related to billing and provided knowledge in excel for data collection and tracking. Once again though, she wanted more. Kristen will graduate in July,2023 with a Master's Degree in Public Health with a Concentration in

Community Health Leadership. In obtaining her degree, Kristen has received a promotion at the Carroll County General Health District becoming the Public Health Emergency Coordinator and Epidemiologist.

Living independently is important to Kristen and with the help of direct care staff, she is able is able to do just that. Kristen serves on the Carroll County Board of Developmental Disabilities Board as Secretary and is also a board member for the Ohio Association of County Boards. Kristen does not let her physical disability stop her from reaching her goals. Congratulations Kristen, you are an inspiration to all!
