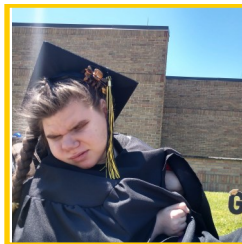

There are many things currently impacting developmental disabilities services. We are researching ways to address COVID for the next school year since the public health emergency has ended. We are also managing increased service referrals for early intervention and service and support administration. The direct support professional shortage is affecting current services. We are reaching out to providers in and outside the county to fill requested services. The Board is providing more job coaching to ensure people do not lose their jobs. We are also experiencing increased costs for staff overtime, increased waiver match, increased support for crisis intervention, and

increased cost for local funding such as family selected services. I want to thank county board staff who are willing to fill in the gaps to ensure services continue. We also appreciate all our providers and all the overtime worked to ensure services continue.

The Board is working with Ohio Network for Innovation, a non-profit that manages houses for people with disabilities, to renovate four current houses. With the funds from the sale of two houses plus an application for capital housing funds from the Ohio Department of Developmental Disabilities, we plan to purchase another house or build a new one for better handicap accessibility.

We had another successful school year. Thank you to all staff, teachers, classroom aides, director of education, administrative assistants, janitor, maintenance, bus drivers, service and support administrator, director of family supports, nurse, and bus drivers. I know I am biased, but I think our staff do an outstanding job. This is evident by reviews from the Ohio Department of Education and Ohio Department of Developmental Disabilities that typically result in zero citations. This is also evident in the number of children that we serve at our school.

I had the privilege to attend graduation this year. It was so nice to see all the families at our school and the children having such a good time. It was also nice to see all the children in the bleachers. It is bittersweet to see preschoolers graduate to kindergarten and high school graduates. A big congratulations goes out to our High School Graduates; Ciara Hilgert, Ryann Young, Tzakary Rainsberg, and Dustin Shafer. We are proud of your accomplishments and wish you well in your future endeavors.

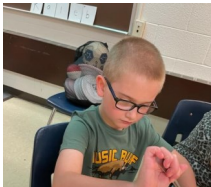
High school and intermediate classes earned a pizza party from the Carrollton Assembly of God Church for their hard work this year.



Intermediate Class



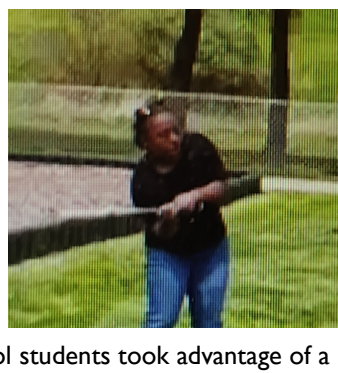

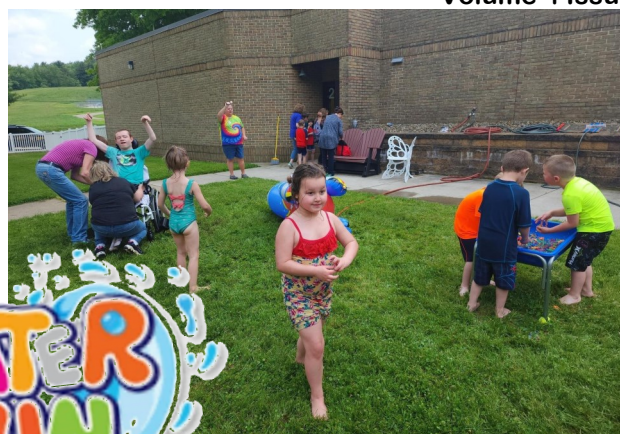

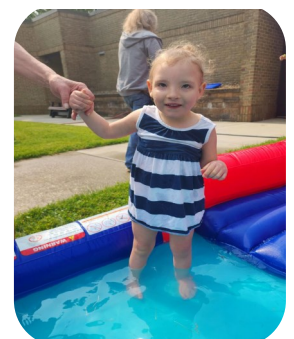


In the Spotlight

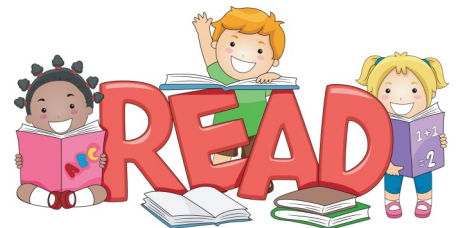
Early Intervention— Sign-up for a free book a month!

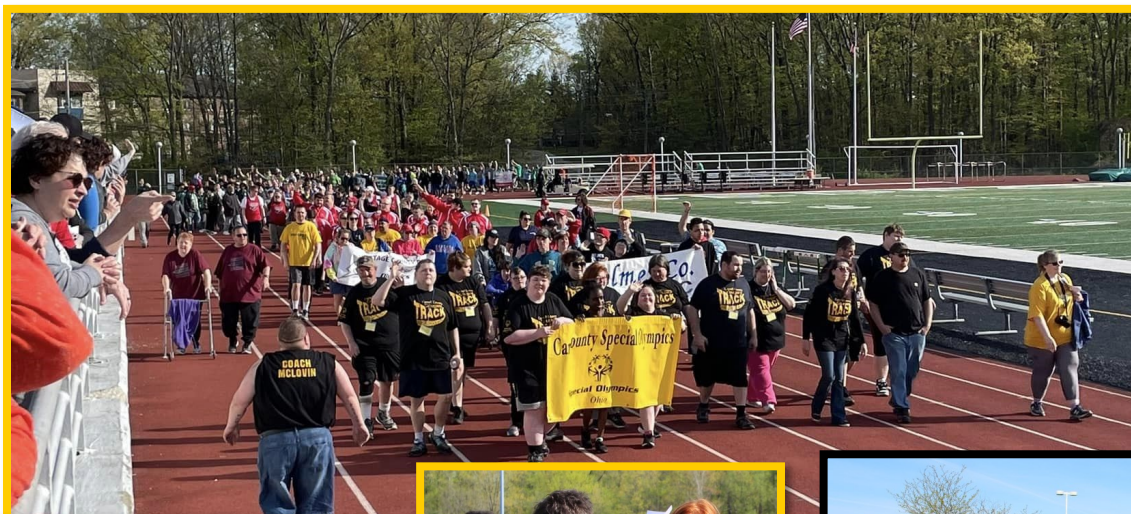




Carroll County Special Olympics
