

Retarded Tests Are Next Week

Psychological tests will be given to mentally retarded children in the county next week, according to Mrs. Franklin Fuss, president of the Carroll County Council for Retarded Children.

Dr. Mary Katherine Vallwalk, psychologist of the Dover Guidance Center, will give the tests in the high school building here as follows: Wednesday and Thursday, June 18 and 19, 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. and 7 to 9 p.m.; Friday, June 20, 9 a.m. until noon.

Parents are to make appointments for the tests with council officers, Mrs. Fuss said. A slight fee will be charged.

Mrs. Harold Wynn, council treasurer, reports the Carrollton Fraternal Order of Eagles contributed \$100 to the organization's fund for a retarded children's class.

Members of the executive board will meet at 8 p.m. Thursday at the home of Mrs. Evelyn Price, vice president. Next regular meeting of the council is June 26.

Seven Eligible for Retarded Class

Executive board of the Carroll County Council for Retarded Children considered three applications for teacher of a mentally retarded class here at a meeting last Thursday.

None of the applicants were found to be fully qualified. The teacher must have a four-year degree. The group discussed the budget and money-making projects. A rummage sale is planned for July.

It was reported that Disabled American Veterans chapter 85 contributed \$25 to the organization's project.

Ten children were given psychological tests here June 18-20 by Dr. Katherine Villwalk of the Dover Guidance Center. Six were found to be eligible for the class. With the one child previously tested, this makes seven eligible. A minimum of eight is required by the state. The board said there are still six children to be tested.

Miss Nancy Jo Kean of Carrollton, a student at Wittenberg College studying to teach retarded children, assisted with the testing.

Next public meeting of the county organization is this Thursday at 8 p.m. in the high school building here.
